A donation will be made from the proceeds of the tournament to the American Cancer Society to help support local programs and projects directed at improving women's breast health. Among them are:

- Reach To Recovery: women who have recently undergone breast surgery provide emotional support to women diagnosed with breast cancer
- Mammogram Voucher Program: provides free vouchers for mammograms during the program
 256 previously undetected breast cancers have been identified among recipients
- Look Good, Feel Better: provides cosmetic assistance with wigs, turbans, make-up and cosmetics to patients undergoing cancer treatment
- Cancer Research: \$9.2 million dollars are at work this year in Pittsburgh cancer research facilities.

The tournament was started in 2001 to honor and remember Dianna Orsini, the wife of a member of the Highlander Rugby Club, who passed away from cancer. Since that time the tournament has raised approximately **\$55,000**. The TACKLE CANCER 10s is aiming to battle and beat breast cancer, the second leading cause of death in women. In Pennsylvania 2,100 women were expected to die from breast cancer in 2005. Fighting with ferocity and tenacity is necessary to win the battle.
